PURSUANT TO THE ANNOUNCEMENT ON 30 JUNE 2020 DURING THE, TALK TO THE PEOPLE OF PRESIDENT RODRIGO ROA DUTERTE ON CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19), THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF TAYTAY THROUGH THE MUNICIPAL INTER-AGENCY TASK FORCE AGAINST COVID-19(MIATF) WOULD LIKE TO INFORM THE PUBLIC OF THE **“MUNICIPALITY OF TAYTAY COMMUNITY QUARANTINE CLASSIFICATION AND ITS CORRESPONDING GUIDELINES FROM JULY 01 TO JULY 15, 2020 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES”**, WHICH EXPLICITLY PROVIDES THE FOLLOWING DIRECTIVES, TO WIT:

SECTION 1. Community Quarantine Classification. Pursuant to the announcement of DOH Secretary Francisco Duque III on June 30 2020 during the Talk to the People of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte, the Province of Palawan and Puerto Princesa City will be placed under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) with strict local action on: localized community quarantine zoning, strict enforcement of minimum public health standards, scale up of health system capacity, isolation facility of ROFs, LSIs and close contacts.

SECTION 2. General Guidelines (Pursuant to 25 June 2020 Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines)

- a. Minimum public health standards shall be complied with at all times for the duration of MGCQ;
- b. The movement of all persons shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, for work in offices or industries permitted to operate and for other permitted activities;
- c. Indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise are allowed provided, that the minimum public health standards are observed;
- d. Mass gatherings shall be allowed, provided that participants shall be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the seating or venue capacity;
- e. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes may be conducted in HEIs, provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, consultations with LGU and compliance with guidelines issued by CHED;
- f. Face-to-face TVET training and competency assessment may be up to fifty percent (50%) training and assessment size capacity, provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, TESDA guidelines and consultation with LGUs;
- g. DepEd Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan shall be adopted for K-12 Basic Education;
- h. Public transportation shall be allowed subject to the guidelines issued by DOTr, provided that a strict one (1) meter distance between passengers shall be observed and appropriate engineering controls shall be in place;
- i. Private transportation shall be allowed subject to the guidelines issued by DOTr;
- j. Barber shops, salons, and other personal care service establishments shall be allowed to operate at fifty percent (50%) of venue capacity; and

- k. Dine-in restaurants, fastfood, carinderias, eateries and the like shall be allowed to operate at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) of seating capacity.

SECTION 3. Local Guidelines (Pursuant to 11 May 2020 Sangguniang Bayan Ordinance No. 372, s. 2020):

- a. All individuals shall continue to observe **curfew hours from 7:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.** subject to exceptions provided in 25 June 2020 Omnibus Guidelines for the Implementation of *Community Quarantine in the Philippines*;
- b. **Modified Liquor Ban.** Consumption of alcoholic beverages and intoxication in public is not allowed;
- c. **“No Back Ride Policy”** is still enforceable unless superseded by succeeding issuances from the National Government, IATF-National, Department of the Interior and Local Government and other national policies and guidelines; and
- d. Pursuant to 11 June 2020 DILG Advisory, in all areas under Community Quarantine, cockfighting or **“sabong”** is banned until such time as the same is allowed through an issuance of the President, the IATF, DILG, or any National Government Agency having jurisdiction on the matter.

SECTION 4. Establishments of Control Points

- a. PNP checkpoints shall remain in all areas under community quarantine and PNP retains its authority to conduct inspection procedures in checkpoints for the purpose of ensuring that community quarantine protocols are observed; and
- b. Barangay control points shall be established along Barangay Roads only, *provided*, they are under the supervision of the PNP.

SECTION 5. Inter-municipal Travel

- a. Rationale.

Following the increasing number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in the Province of Palawan and in the City of Puerto Princesa, the Municipal Inter-Agency Task Force Against COVID-19 strongly believes that there is an immediate need to establish measures necessary to protect the Taytayanos from any possible exposure to the virus and to curtail the potential risks of community transmission in the Municipality.

COVID-19 Advisory (108) aired on June 25, 2020 9:45 a.m. of the City Information Department of Puerto Princesa City, Dr. Dean Palanca- City Incident Commander, announced that there are five (5) additional confirmed cases categorized as community transmission.

As of July 2, 2020, Palawan recorded a total of thirty-nine (39) confirmed cases, eighteen (18) from Puerto Princesa City, six (6) from Sofronio Española, six (6) from Bataraza, three (3) from Coron, three (3) from Busuanga, two (2) from Cuyo and one (1) from Taytay.

Such highly alarming surge of confirmed cases caused several municipalities in Palawan to tighten their borders.

- b. All residents of this Municipality are **highly discouraged to travel to Puerto Princesa City and to other municipalities with reported confirmed cases.** This is to avoid and control subsequent effects of potential exposure to the virus; and
- c. All incoming residents and non-residents shall fill-up health declarations forms at major control points of this municipality and all entry points in the barangays;

- d. All incoming residents and non-residents are enjoined to undergo a fourteen (14)-day Home Quarantine

SECTION 6. Social Responsibility

- a. Everyone is encouraged/enjoined to report all violations of Minimum Public Health Standards (MPHS) and uncoordinated arrivals for proper disposition of the Municipal Inter-Agency Task Force (MIATF) Against COVID-19.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. This shall take effect immediately.


